TO: Commission District #1 New Motor Vehicle Dealers

RE: Dealer Plates

Currently, dealer plates issued by the Louisiana Department of Public Safety, Office of Motor Vehicles expire the same month as your Louisiana Motor Vehicle Commission, New Motor Vehicle Dealer license.

LSA-R.S. 49:961 B. provides: When a licensee has made timely and sufficient application for the renewal of a license or a new license with reference to any activity of a continuing nature, the existing license shall not expire until the application has been finally determined by the agency, and, in case the application is denied or the terms of the new license limited, until the last day for seeking review of the agency order or a later date fixed by order of the reviewing court.

At our suggestion and request, the Office of Motor Vehicles has changed the month of the expiration date of your dealer plates as pursuant to LSA-R.S. 49:961B, your license does not expire provided you have made **timely** application for renewal of your New Motor Vehicle Dealer license. This change will allow more time and will avoid an expiration of your dealer plate should your renewal license be delayed.
